

School AI Policy for Students

1. Responsible Use

Students may use AI tools (e.g., ChatGPT, Grammarly, image generators) only with permission from teachers and must ensure the usage aligns with the school's policies.

2. Academic Integrity

AI-generated content must not be submitted as original student work unless explicitly allowed. Using AI to complete assignments without permission is considered cheating.

3. Disclosure of AI Use

When permitted to use AI tools, students must clearly disclose what tools were used and how they contributed to the final work (e.g., "ChatGPT was used for brainstorming of ideas").

4. Data Privacy

Students must not enter personal information (their own or others') into AI tools. AI systems may store data, and privacy cannot be guaranteed.

5. No Bypassing Restrictions

Students must not attempt to bypass content filters, restrictions, or access blocked AI tools using VPNs or other methods on school devices or networks.

6. Respect and Ethics

AI tools must not be used to create or share harmful, offensive, or misleading content, including fake news, or inappropriate material.

7. Critical Thinking First

AI should support learning, not replace it. Students are encouraged to think independently and use AI as a supplementary tool, not a shortcut.

8. Supervised Access

Use of AI tools during school hours should occur under teacher supervision or with explicit guidance, especially for research, writing, or project work.

9. Creativity and Originality

Students are encouraged to use AI for inspiration (e.g., idea generation or drafts), but final submissions must reflect their own voice and understanding.

10. Consequences for Misuse

Misuse of AI will result in consequences aligned with the school's code of conduct, including possible academic penalties or restricted access to technology resources.
